## Size Guide

Falling in love with a new piece of furniture, only to get it home and find it doesn't fit through the door is incredibly frustrating. By following our easy to use size guide, we can help you measure your home so that your new Arlo \& Jacob furniture should fit comfortably into your room of choice. ## Step 1. Measure the furniture

You'll find all these measurements on our website, on the backs of our product detail cards and in our brochure.

## Step 2. Measure the entrances

Now we need to measure all the entrances that lead to your room of choice. The easiest route may be through a front window (if it's large enough).
Remember you may have to get the furniture through doorways, around any awkward corners, and perhaps even up or down stairs or into a lift.


Open up the doors as wide as you can and use our handy table to measure and note down the narrowest points of all the entryways that our delivery drivers will have to go through to get your sofa into your chosen room.

Take into consideration any obstructions such as radiators, skirting boards and light fittings and adjust your measurements accordingly.

Use our handy table to note down all the measurements that apply to you:

| Doorway | Narrowest Width (cm) | Narrowest Height (cm) |

If the width of each entrance is greater than the smallest furniture measurement, then fantastic news, it should fit!

## Leave a few centimetres gap to avoid it getting stuck and for fingers.

Remember you want to leave enough space for other furniture and to give clearance for doors and people walking past. Consider where in the room you want to have your new furniture. If your sofa is next to a side table, factor this into the overall space that you will need.
——Top Tip
Mark out the area with masking tape, or place newspapers on the floor according to the measurements of your furniture to understand how much surrounding space will be left.
